Development expenditure of P 12.24 billion proposed for 2014-15

- P 3.55 billion towards development of infrastructure in minerals, energy and water resources
- P 1.875 billion towards transport and communication, air transport infrastructure and information, communication and technology facilities
- P 1.271 billion towards rural development, village infrastructure and primary schools

Recurrent expenditure of P 33.32 billion proposed for 2014-15

- P 1.95 billion towards transport and communication

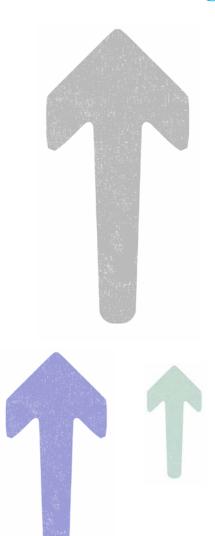

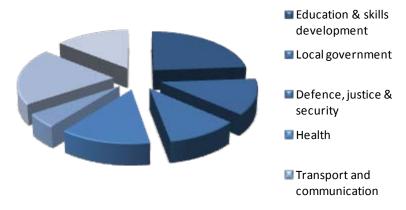

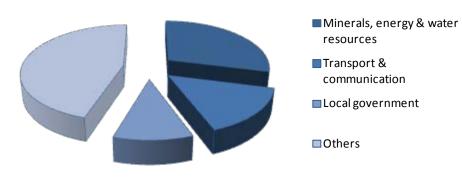

Tax amendments

Proposed amendments

- Increase in registration threshold from P 500 000 to P 1 million.
- Basic farming equipment and food items to move from **zero rated to exempt supplies**.
- Basic food items to include vegetables, rice and milk amongst others.
- •Amendments to Transfer Duty Act proposed which are meant to **encourage home ownership.**

Amendments and procedures effected during 2013

- •Exemption of VAT on import of personal goods increased from ZAR 500 to ZAR 1200 per person.
- Harmonisation of interest charged on late payments made at 1.5% per month compounded.
- E filing of VAT returns effected on selective tax payers.
- E services solution implemented and will be availed to all tax users.



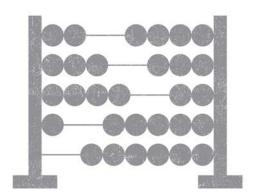
